the laws of this State, to transact business therein, and to re-enact the same with amendments, and to add the same to Article 56 of the Code of Public General Laws of this State.

The undersigned has also in course of preparation, and will submit at an early day, a bill to amend Article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licenses," by adding sections providing for the issuing of licenses to traders to sell by sample in this State; and a bill to provide for the assessment and collection of the State taxes on the shares of the capital stock of National Banks in this State omitted in former assessments.
