county to organize an effective police force near Baltimore City.

Leave was granted to the Baltimore county delegation to introduce a bill to repeal section 63, of Article 3, of the Public Local Laws, title "Baltimore County," sub-title "County Commissioners," and re-enact the same with amendments.
