

Which was read a first time, and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Also,

Returned the bill entitled an Act to repeal section 25 of Article 12 Code of Public General Laws, title "Harford County," sub-title "Collectors," and re-enact the same with amendments,

Endorsed, "Reported unfavorably from a Select Committee, and the report adopted."

The bill entitled an Act to provide for the defence of Officers of Registration, Judges of Election, and others who are or may be indicted in the United States Court, for acts done in the performance of duties imposed or in the exercise of rights secured under the Constitution and Laws of this State, which acts are alleged to be in violation of the Act of Congress approved May 31st, 1870, entitled "An Act to enforce the right of citizens of the United States to vote in the several States of this Union, and for other purposes,"

Was read a third time.

The question then recurring upon the passage of the bill, Mr. Koons moved to strike out the enacting clause of the bill.
