On motion of Mr. Keech,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 41, 42 and 43 of the Public General Laws, title "Testamentary Law," sub-title "Administration by an Executor," and to re-enact the same, or such sections as may be necessary, with amendments.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bills, Severally endorsed, "Passed by yeas and nays."

A bill entitled an Act to refund to Morgan H. Clark, of Washington county, the sum of fifty dollars, paid by him into the Treasury on or about the 24th day of January 1872.

A bill entitled an Act to provide for cases of vacancy in the office of Governor, according to the 7th section of the second Article of the Constitution.
