The bill entitled an Act supplementary to the Act to incorporate the Hannah More Academy of Baltimore county, passed at December session, 1839, chapter 189.

The bill entitled an Act to vest certain property therein mentioned in the Westminster Presbyterian Church, in Kent county.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Carroll county, in their discretion, to pay annually a sum of money, not to exceed three hundred dollars, to defray the expenses of Georgiana Young, a lunatic, during the time of her lunacy.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to authorize Hashabiah Haines, of Carroll county, to settle his accounts as guardian to William L. Haines, in the Orphans' Court of Baltimore City, and to deliver over the estate to his said ward.

Said bill was then read a second time.

Mr. Gordy, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to prevent trespassing with gun or dog in Dorchester county, and to prescribe penalties therefor.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Hodson, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to give an additional Justice of the Peace to the 10th election district of Dorchester county.
