Mr. Bird nominated J. B. Askew for the term of six years.

Mr. Suit nominated Robert Turner for the term of four years.

Mr. Miller nominated C. C. Fulton for the term of two years.

The Secretary of the Senate and Clerk of the House of Delegates proceeded to call the roll of their respective Houses.

Whereupon, each member proceeded to ballot.

Upon counting the ballots,

Mr. Lloyd, on the part of the tellers, made the following REPORT.

House of Delegates, February 3rd, 1874.

At a Joint Meeting of the Senate and House of Delegates, held in compliance with an Act passed January session, 1874, providing for the election of three persons to constitute the Board of Police Commissioners of the City of Baltimore, the tellers appointed respectfully report that there were ninety-six ballots cast, of which number,
