A bill entitled an Act supplementary to an Act entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Allegany county to build a new Jail in Allegany county, and for other purposes, passed at January session, 1872, chapter 65.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Allegany delegation.

A bill entitled an Act to enlarge and define the powers of the Boy's Home Society of Baltimore.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary.

A bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Garrett county, to provide for and defray the expenses of taking the census of said county.
