

On motion of Mr. Grafton,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Claims to introduce a bill to pay P. H. Rutledge & Co., of Harford county, for publishing list of defaulters.

On motion of Mr. Brace,

Leave was granted to the Allegany delegation to introduce a bill to repeal section 94, of Article 1, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Allegany County," sub-title "Justices of the Peace and Constables," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Also,

Leave was granted to the Committee on the Judiciary to introduce a bill to repeal section 46, of Article 28, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "County Commissioners," sub-title "Private Roads," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to repeal the Act passed at January session, 1872, chapter 260, entitled an Act to repeal section 28, (but erroneously styled section 38 in said Act,) of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Prince George's County," sub-title "Bladensburg," and to amend and re-enact the same.
