A bill entitled an Act supplemental to an Act to incorporate the Dulaney's Valley and Towsontown Turnpike Company, passed January session, 1856, chapter 24.

A bill entitled an Act to prohibit the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Frederick county from issuing license to vendors of spirituous or fermented liquors, within three miles of post office at Hansonville, Frederick county.

A bill entitled an Act to prohibit the Clerk of the Circuit Court of Frederick county, from issuing license to vendors of spirituous liquors within two and one-half miles of Brook Hill Meeting-House, Frederick county.

A bill entitled an Act regulating the sale of reserved seats in Theatres, Concert and Lecture-Rooms, and other places of public amusements in the State of Maryland.
