Wherefore your memorialists pray that an Act may be passed, allowing them to make the same charge for the transportation of passengers as other roads in the city of Baltimore, or for such modification of the twenty per cent. tax on the gross receipts of the Company as may seem just and proper to your memorialists, and likewise to the corporation of Baltimore, in view of all the facts and circumstances surrounding the case.
