

vision of profits until the several payments received shall be equal to the price of the shares, and thereupon cease to exist.

Sec. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the borrower shall to all intents and purposes be deemed a member of such Association or Corporation, and shall have and enjoy every right and privilege that is accorded to every other member in the business and management of such Associations.

Sec. 5. *And be it enacted*, That this Act shall take effect from its passage.
