A bill entitled an Act to authorize a re-codification of the Public General and Public Local Laws of this State, to provide for the payment of the same, and to purchase copies thereof when printed.

Mr. Keech, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 138, of Article 16, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Chancery," subtitle "Trustee," as enacted by chapter 370 of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, in the year 1870, and to re-enact the said section with amendments.

Mr. Lee, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 233 of the Acts of 1868, entitled an Act to amend the charter of the Philadelphia, Wilmington and Baltimore Rail Road Company.

Mr. Freaner, Chairman of the Committee on the Judiciary, reported unfavorably,

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 22, of Article 11, of the Code of Public General Laws, and to re-enact a substitute therefor.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeat the 23rd section of Article 75 of the Code of Public General Laws, and to re-enact the same with amendments, so that attachment proceedings may be amended.
