Section 2, line 5, after the word "dog," insert the words "male or female;" and in same line, after the words "additional dog," insert the words "male or female;" and in line 6, strike out to the word "year," inclusive; line 8, after the word "dog," insert the words "male or female;" line 11, after the word "dog," insert "male or female."

The amendments proposed were severally read and adopted.
