A bill entitled an Act to provide an Interpreter for the Orphans' Court for Baltimore City.

A bill entitled an Act to regulate the salary of the Crier of the Superior Court, Court of Common Pleas and Baltimore City Court, of the City of Baltimore.

Mr. Brace, from the Committee on the Judiciary, (the rules being suspended,) reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to regulate proceedings in certain cases now pending in the Circuit Court for Allegany county.

Which was read a first time, and,

On motion of Mr. Brace,

Ordered to be printed.

On motion of Mr. Greenfield, (the rules being suspended,)

The House proceeded to the consideration of the bill entitled an Act to establish the Maryland House of Correction.

Said bill being upon a third reading,
