Said bill was then sent to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate returned the following bill:

The bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 287, of the laws passed at the January session, 1870, and to repeal sections 810, 811 and 816, of Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, of Baltimore City, sub-title "Police," and to re-enact the following in lieu thereof,

Endorsed "Passed by yeas and nays, with proposed amendments."

AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

In section 810, printed bill, page 3, line 21, after the words "*provided, however,*" strike out all down to the word "force," in the 23rd line, and insert the following: "That if any officer of police, policeman or detective shall be incapacitated for the performance of duty by reason of sickness or disability incurred in the line of his duty for six consecutive months, he may, at the expiration of that time, be dismissed from the force; *Provided further, however,* That the said Board shall have the power to dismiss said officer of police, policeman or detective, before that time, if in their judgment they may deem it proper."

Strike out the whole of section 811.

Strike out in section 816, lines 13 and 14, the words "Mayor, Comptroller, and."

Strike out from the word "Baltimore," in line 14, of said section, all the balance of the section.

In the title of the bill, strike out the words "eight hundred and eleven."

Which were severally read.
