AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add between the words "that" and "every," in line two, section one, the following: "In all cases where notice has been given through the public prints or otherwise by the owners or possessors of land in Dorchester county, forewarning all persons from hunting with dog or gun on said lands, then, and in that case."

The Senate bill entitled an Act supplementary to an Act of November session, 1812, chapter 159, entitled "An Act for founding a University in the City or precincts of Baltimore, by the name of the University of Maryland," and to authorize the Regents of the University of Maryland to dispose of a portion of the property held by the said University for the use of its Faculty of Physic, and to apply the proceeds towards the erection of a Hospital for the use of said Faculty and the School of Medicine under its direction.
