The bill entitled an Act to authorize the County Commissioners of Garrett county to borrow money on the credit of the county, for the purpose of erecting a court house and county jail, to issue bonds for the payment of the same, and to levy taxes on the assessable property of the county to redeem said bonds and to pay the interest thereon,
