A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 13, of Article 29, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Courts," and re-enact the same with amendments.

Also, without amendment,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to legalize the bequest made by William Thomas Syers, to St. Patrick's Church of Cumberland, Allegany county, Maryland.

Which was read a second time.

Also, without amendment,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to amend the 29th Article of the Code of Public General Laws, relating to "Courts and Judgments," by adverting thereto an additional section.

Which was read a second time.

Also, without amendment,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 1 and 7, of Article 36, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Estrays and Vessels Adrift," and to re-enact the same with amendments.
