The Senate bill entitled an Act to amend and to enlarge the powers conferred upon the Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore and his successors, by the Act passed at December session, 1832, chapter 308, and by supplements thereto, passed at January session, 1868, chapter 268.

A bill entitled an Act to authorize George Little and Thomas V. Hunter, surviving Trustees of the Wiseburgh Church, to sell and convey certain real estate.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 2 and 6, of Article 53, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Landlord and Tenant," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

A bill entitled an Act to repeal section 102, of Article 1, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Allegany County," sub-title "Manufactories and Minors," and re-enact the same with amendments.

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Glotfelty, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported without amendment,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to regulate the number of Justices of the Peace and Constables for Garrett county.

Which was read a second time.

Mr. Fenton, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to add an additional section to Article 4, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore."

Which was read a first time.

Mr. Merrill, Chairman of a Select Committee, reported without amendment,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 20, of chapter 320, of the Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, passed at the January session, 1867, entitled an Act to incorporate the Worcester and Somerset Rail Road Company.
