

No. 60. An Act to alter and amend the charter of the Hampshire and Baltimore Coal Company, incorporated by an Act entitled an Act to recognize the Hampshire and Baltimore Coal Company, a corporation created by and existing under the laws of the State of West Virginia, as a corporation in the State of Maryland, and to authorize it to exercise the powers and privileges of a corporation within the State of Maryland, for mining and other purposes, passed at January session, 1864, chapter 295, by repealing the second section thereof, and amending the same and re-enacting it as amended.

No. 71. An Act to repeal section 180, of Article 30, of the supplement to the Code of Public General Laws, relating to Sabbath breaking, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
