The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 15, of Article 29, of the Code of Public General Laws, and re-enact the same.

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Amend by adding after the last word of the seventh line of section 1, the following: *Provided*, That no verdict or award of a jury of inquisition or condemnation shall carry interests until the property condemned shall be actually taken possession of by the party in whose favor said verdict or award may have been rendered.

The proposed amendment was adopted, and the bill read a second time.
