

Statement showing the Amount of Revenue derived from Licenses authorizing the Sale of Spirituous or Fermented Liquors in this State during the fiscal year 1873:

The assessed value of property in this State, for the year 1873, was \$424,672,712.00, upon which a tax of four cents on each \$100 would produce \$169,869.08.

Mr. Merryman presented the petition of Pleasant Hunter, F. O. Mitchell, M. D., Henry N. Merryman and forty-one other persons, in favor of annexing Baltimore county and city.

Which was read and referred to the Select Committee on the Extension of the Limits of Baltimore City.

Mr. Robinson presented the petition of Joseph P. Smith, a soldier of the war of 1812, asking to be placed upon the pension rolls of the State.
