The Senate bill entitled "An Act to prevent Swine from running at large in Quantico, Wicomico county,"

The Senate bill entitled "An Act to repeal section 2 of chapter 362, of the Acts of 1870, so far as the same provides that no extra assessment shall be made, and no extra or special tax shall be levied or collected on any bridge or bridges over a navigable stream forming any part of the roadway of any railroad or railroads in this State, and to re-enact the same as amended."

Which was read the first time.
