Decided in the negative.

Mr. McCosker submitted the following amendment:

AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Add as an additional section, to be section 2:

*And be it enacted*, That if the proposed extension of the city limits be rejected by the people, this Act shall be of no effect.

The bill, as amended, was then read a second time, and,
