A bill entitled an Act to amend and re-enact sections 1, 4, 18 and 58, to 86 inclusive, of Article 56, of the Code of Public General Laws, entitled "Licenses," to repeal section 19 of said Article, and to add further sections to said Article, regulating the sales of intoxicating liquors.

The bill entitled an Act for the protection of partridges and to prevent trespassing with dog or gun on private property in Kent county,
