The following Acts of Assembly were this day presented to his Excellency the Governor, for his approval, viz :

No. 76. An Act to locate the county seat of Garrett county.

No. 77. An Act to repeal section 1 of an Act passed at the January session, eighteen hundred and seventy two, chapter 131, entitled an Act for the better protection of oysters, clams, terrapins and fish, in the Synepuxent Bay and its tributaries, in Worcester county, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
