No. 79. An Act for the protection of black bass and all other fish in the Patapsco above tidewater.

No. 80. An Act to add additional sections to Article 41 of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Fish and Fisheries," sub-title "Patuxent."

No. 81. An Act to empower the Board of Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Cumberland to sell and convey a certain lot of ground in said city.

No. 82. An Act to repeal sections 9 and 10, of Article 1, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Allegany county, and to re-enact the said sections with amendments.

No. 83. An Act to repeal sections 54, 55, 56 and 57, of Article 21, of the Code of Public Local Laws, relating to Washington county, and to re enact said sections with amendments.

No. 84. An Act to prevent trespassing with gun or dog in Dorchester county, and to prescribe penalties therefor.

No. 85. An Act to authorize and empower the County Commissioners of Washington county to subscribe to the capital stock of Turnpike Companies in said county.

No. 86. An Act to repeal an Act entitled an Act to incorporate the First Hagerstown Hose Company, passed December session, 1822, chapter 42, and to amend and re-enact the same as follows, &c.

No. 87. An Act to incorporate the Mechanicstown Town Hall Company, in the town of Mechanicstown, Frederick county.

No. 88. An Act to incorporate the Farmers' Manufacturing Company of New Market.

No. 89. An Act for the better protection of birds in Garrett county.

No. 90. An Act to provide for the re-division of Allegany county into election districts.

No. 91. An Act supplemental to an Act to incorporate the Dulany's Valley and Towsontown Turnpike Company, passed January session, 1856, chapter 24.

No. 92. An Act to repeal an Act passed at January session, 1872, chapter 67, entitled an Act to prevent swine from running at large in the streets, lanes and alleys contiguous to Burkittsville, in Frederick county, and to re-enact the same with amendments.
