Leave was granted to the Anne Arundel delegation to introduce a bill to provide that whenever any person may be convicted in any of the Courts of Anne Arundel county of any crime or misdemeanor, and who is liable under existing law to be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not less than three months and not exceeding three years, such Court may, in its discretion, sentence such person to labor upon the public roads of the county instead of such imprisonment.

Leave was granted to the Baltimore City delegation to introduce a bill entitled an Act to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to issue bonds to an extent not to exceed the sum of one million dollars, with which to purchase the Baltimore City Passenger Railway, as authorized by Act of the General Assembly.
