Leave was granted to the Committee on Federal Relations to introduce a bill in relation to the cession of certain lands, near Fort Washington, to the United States.

On motion of Mr. Latchford,

Leave was granted to the Prince George's delegation to introduce a bill to authorize the County Commissioners of Prince George's county to purchase or have erected at Marlboro', a suitable dwelling for the Sheriff and Jailor.

On motion of Mr. Nutwell,

Leave was granted to the Committee on Corporations to introduce a bill to regulate the charges for passengers and freights on all railroads in this State.

Mr. Stewart, of Baltimore City, from the Committee on the Judiciary, reported favorably,

A bill entitled an Act to amend Article 10, of the Code of Public General Laws of this State, relating to Attachments, by adding thereto an additional section relating to the attachment of the wages or hire of non-residents of this State.

Which was read a first time.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following bill,

A bill entitled an Act to provide for Indexing the Land and Chattel Records of Baltimore county.
