AMENDMENT PROPOSED.

Section 1, under head "Legislature," line 86, strike out the word "three," and insert "five."

Which was adopted.

Said bill was then read a second time, and,

Ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The Secretary of the Senate returned the following bill :

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 827, chapter 473, of the Acts of Assembly, passed January session, 1870, entitled an Act to add an additional section to Article 4 of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "City of Baltimore," subtitle "Police," and to amend and re-enact the same (as amended,)

Line 14, after the word "examination," insert "except for disorderly conduct or theft;" line 18, strike out the word "fifty" and insert "ten."

Add new section :

SECTION 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
