

party or road so aggrieved shall have the right to recover from the said Baltimore and Potomac Railroad Company, by action in any Court of Law in this State, of competent jurisdiction, a sum of not less than five hundred nor more than one thousand dollars per each day of such refusal or neglect."

The proposed amendment was adopted.

Mr. Merryman moved that the bill be referred to the Committee on Corporations.

The motion was rejected.

The bill was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

On motion of Mr. Gill,

The bill was made the order of the day for to-morrow at 12 o'clock, M.

The Senate bill entitled an Act to establish a State Board of Health,
