and sheep from running at large within one half mile of the Court-House in Towsontown, Baltimore county, Maryland,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore to purchase at its discretion the property of the Western Maryland Rail Road Company, and to issue the bonds of the City of Baltimore in order to provide for the payment-money for said purchase,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to authorize the Commissioners of Baltimore county to grant rights of way through the jail lot of said county to the Towsontown Rail Road Company, and to the Maryland and Pennsylvania Rail Road Company,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to authorize George Tittle and Thomas V. Hunter, surviving Trustees of the Wiseburg Church, to sell and convey certain real estate,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 63 and 64, of Article 3, of the Code of Public Local Laws, title "Baltimore County," sub-title "County Commissioners," and to re-enact section 63 with an amendment,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to authorize and empower the Trustees of Primary School District No. 104, of Frederick county, to dispose of a school-house in said district,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Citizens' Gas Company of Baltimore,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill entitled an Act to protect fish in the Great Gunpowder River and its tributaries, within the limits of Baltimore county,

Was read a second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
