the appointment of a Joint Special Committee of five, two on the part of the Senate and three on the part of the House, to visit the House of Refuge and Maryland Penitentiary, and to examine into their condition—the manner in which they are conducted—and to report to the two Houses.

We have appointed on the part of the Senate Messrs. Blake and Aydelotte.
