

Also,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to change the name of the South Baltimore Chemical Works, incorporated by chapter 108, of the Act of the General Assembly of 1860, to that of the Chappell Chemical and Fertilizer Company.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Corporations.

Also,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to repeal section 5, of chapter 381, of the Act of 1872, so far as it relates to Prince George's county, entitled an Act to provide for the destruction of hawks and owls, and to protect the class of small birds, known as insectivorous birds, in Prince George's, Talbot and Montgomery counties.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

Also,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to promote the increase and growth of fish and terrapins in the waters of this State.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on the Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries.

Also,

A bill entitled an Act to pay to Thomas Dent, Justice of the Peace for St. Mary's county, and also James H. Saunders, a Constable of said county, for services rendered to Captain Timmons in the execution of the Oyster Laws of this State.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means.

Also,

A bill entitled an Act to regulate Sheriff's fees for Garrett county.

Which was read a first time and referred to the Garrett county delegation, with Mr. Leonard, of Wicomico county.

Also,

A bill entitled an Act to regulate and prescribe the manner of holding post-mortem examinations, and analyzing the stomach, bowels or contents thereof, and of other portions of the human body, whenever any person is, or persons are suspected to have died from poison administered by any person for the purpose of causing death, or for procuring any poison to be taken by any person for the purpose of causing the death of any person.
