Mr. Wier, from a Select Committee, reported unfavorably,

A bill entitled an Act to suppress intemperance, and to permit the voters of Allegany county, in the State of Maryland, to vote on the question of granting licenses to sell intoxicating liquors.

The question recurring upon the adoption of the report,

Mr. Park moved that the bill be substituted for the unfavorable report of the Committee.

Which was decided in the negative.

The unfavorable report was then adopted.

Mr. Watkins, Chairman of the Committee on Ways and Means, reported unfavorably upon,

The Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to enable the Faculty of Physic of the University of Maryland, to build a Hospital and to appropriate a sum of money to the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Baltimore, and a sum of money to the Hebrew Hospital of Baltimore.

The question recurring upon concurring in the report,

On motion of Mr. Maclin,

The bill was substituted for the unfavorable report of the Committee.
