The Senate bill entitled "An Act to authorize the United States to procure the condemnation of lands within the State of Maryland, for certain purposes, and ceding jurisdiction thereof where so condemned to the United States.

The Senate bill entitled "An Act to provide for the relinquishment to the United States in certain cases of title to and jurisdiction over land for sites of light-houses, beacons, and other aids to navigation, for the protection of beacons, buoys, and floating-guides on the coast and in the waters of this State."
