The bill entitled an Act ceding to the United States of America the jurisdiction over the lands in Prince George's county, owned by the United States, and constituting the site of Fort Washington, and also over lands that may hereafter be conveyed to the United States, adjoining thereto, for military and naval purposes, and which are herein described.
