Said bill was then returned to the Senate.

The Secretary of the Senate delivered the following message:

The Senate bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money for the use and benefit of the House of Reformation and Instruction for Colored Children, situated in Prince George's county, for the erection of an additional family building and other necessary shops and out-houses,

Which had been rejected for want of a constitutional majority,

Was passed by yeas and nays, as follows:
