The bill entitled an Act to appropriate a sum of money to pay the claims of T. B. Jones, James Brown, B. O. Bowen, B. L. Barker, William Mencher, Jas. J. Duke, J. T. Lyons, George A. Fowler, John French, John Denton, E. Cecil, John E. Griffin, William Lemmon, John Reirdon, George Gibson, R. E. Ireland, George Robinson, Thomas Tongue and J. T. Ireland.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal sections 2 and 6, of Article 53, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "Landlord and Tenant," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

The bill entitled an Act authorizing the County Commissioners of Baltimore county to invest a certain amount of the money belonging to said county.

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 138, of Article 26, of the Code of Public General Laws, as enacted at Jan-
