The bill entitled an Act to refund to Francis Neal & Sons, of Baltimore City, for the benefit of John Parsons, Samuel Cox and others, monies erroneously paid by them to Inspectors of Tobacco in Baltimore City, for storage and outage.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to incorporate the Baltimore and Annapolis Rail Road Company.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to establish a free bridge over the Patapsco River, between Anne Arundel and Baltimore counties, at or near the present site of Sweetzer's Bridge.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal chapter 169, of the Act of 1872, entitled an Act for the better protection of part-ridges in Queen Anne's county, and also to add an additional section to Article 98 of the Code.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 20, of Article 28, of the Code of Public General Laws, title "County Commissioners," sub-title "Roads," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 193, of Article 3, of the Code of Public Local Laws of Baltimore county, sub-title "Sheriff," passed at the January session of the Legislature, in the year 1872, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to compensate Jacob Socey, of Washington county, for the arrest of the murderers of Captain Harry Miller.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to repeal section 72, of Article 5, of the Code of Public Local Laws, entitled "Calvert County," sub-title "Sheriff," and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Also,

The bill entitled an Act to empower Josiah F. Cockey, of Baltimore county, executor of Josiah F. Cockey, late of Baltimore county, deceased, to donate a lot of ground to a Church or Religious Society, as he may select, and give title to the same.
