forty-seven, has continued without interruption, its work of thorough instruction in Latin, Greek, French and Mathematics, as well as the usual branches of English and Military Drill. No case of insubordination has occurred, and the School is especially noted for its superior discipline, as well as its remarkable exemption from sickness.

Twelve pupils have been educated free. The charge for Tuition is \$28 for ten months. The charge for board and washing \$150 for ten months. Four teachers have been employed.
