

LAWS OF MARYLAND.

Maryland, Sct.

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, on the Seventh day of January, 1874, His Excellency JAMES BLACK GROOME, being Governor, from and after the fourth day of March, 1874, the following Laws were enacted, to wit:

CHAPTER 55.

AN ACT to add additional sections to article twelve of the code of Public Local Laws of Harford county, in regard to horses and carriages kept at livery in Harford county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the following sections be, and they are hereby added to article twelve of the code of Public Local Laws of Harford county, and be annexed under a separate title as, "horses and carriages at livery," as follows:

1. It shall be lawful for any livery stable keeper, or hotel proprietor in Harford county, to retain in his custody, any horse, mare, gelding, or mule, placed under his care for livery, and also any vehicle, until all charges for so keeping shall have been paid by the owner or owners thereof.
