

scribed in the first section of this act, and in default of payment of the said fine and impounding fee, the said swine may be sold to satisfy the same.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That the fine imposed and collected, under this article, shall be applied one-half to the informer and the balance to the paving of streets in the village of Burkittsville, under the supervision of the justice of the peace, by whom such fine was collected. ^{Application of fines}

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the constables, residing in or nearest to the said village of Burkittsville, to enforce the provisions of this law, and if in any case he fails to do so, he shall be liable to a fine of two dollars, to be recovered against him, before any justice of the peace of said county, in an action of debt in the name of the State, use of informer who shall be entitled to all of the said fine. ^{Liable to fine.}

SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That in any case against the said constable it shall be *prima facie* evidence of negligence to perform the duty under the provisions of this act, for the informer to prove to the satisfaction of the justice of the peace that the defendant knew that the law had been violated. ^{Evidence.}

CHAPTER 93.

AN ACT to authorize the County Commissioners of Dorchester county, to subscribe to the capital stock of the Cambridge and Chesapeake Railroad Company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That upon the incorporation of the Cambridge and Chesapeake Railroad Company, the County Commissioners of Dorchester county, be and ^{To subscribe for stock}
