

CHAPTER 117.

AN ACT to incorporate the Town of Huntington,  
Prince George's county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the citizens of the Town of Huntington, in Prince George's county, are hereby constituted a body corporate, by the name of the Commissioners of Huntington, and by that name may have perpetual succession, sue and be sued, and have and use a common seal. Incorporation

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That the limits, and extent of said town, shall be the same as laid down and plotted on the official plat of Huntington as filed and recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Prince George's county. Limits

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the said Board of Commissioners are hereby empowered, whenever requested by a majority of the legal voters within the limits of the proposed extension, to extend and enlarge the limits of said corporation, by having the contemplated extension surveyed, and the bounds thereof established, a copy of which survey shall be recorded among the records of the corporation. Extend limits.

SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That the legal voters of said town, who have resided therein for the space of six months next preceeding the first Monday in April next, may on that day, at the old Post-office, and on the first Monday in April, in each and every year thereafter, at such place as may be designated by the Board of Commissioners, be authorized to elect three commissioners of said town, who shall have resided within the limits of the same at least one year next preceeding the election, and who shall be property-holders within said limits. Elect Commissioners

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That John Seitz, Lemuel Porter and George F. Ebery, are hereby empowered to act as judges of the first election for said commissioners, who shall keep the polls open from two o'clock P. M. to six o'clock P. M., and shall conduct the said election, in the same manner as an elec- Judges of the election.
