Ordered, That it be entered on the Journal, that Senator Blake is not in his seat, on account of sickness.

Mr. Steiner presented the petition of Andrew Boyd, James Whitehill and John H. Keller, the majority of the Board of Trustees of the Methodist Episcopal Church of Frederick city, remonstrating against any alteration of the charter of said Church, without the consent of said corporation.
