chapter three hundred and twenty, entitled "an act for the protection of black bass and all other fish in the Monocacy River and its tributaries, within the limits of Frederick county," be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

1. From and after the passage of this act, it shall not be lawful for any person or persons to take, cap-Not lawfulture or destroy fish by seine or seines, dragnet or dragnets, fish-baskets or fish pots, ell-weirs, brush or fascine nets, or any means or contrivance whatever, of the nature of a seine, which are known to destroy or capture fish, in the Monocacy River, or any of its tributaries, within the limits of Frederick county, in the State; provided, that it may be lawful to [lawfulto] take fish in any way in any of the said tributaries, one mile above the mouth of such tributaries.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That this act shall take In force effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 174.

AN ACT to pay to Banner Graves, of Washington county, the sum of twenty dollars, pension due to Joseph Graves, late of Washington county, deceased, a soldier of the war of eighteen hundred and twelve.

WHEREAS, Joseph Graves, late of Washington county, deceased, a soldier of the war of eighteen Presemble. hundred and twelve, departed this life intestate, leaving no estate to be administered upon except the sum of twenty dollars, being the amount due to him on a pension from the State of Maryland, at the time of his death, and whereas Banner Graves has paid the funeral expenses of the deceased soldier, therefore—
