dred and sixty-four, to pay to the said Hambleton the amount due him, as legal fees, for serving said writs of summons; and whereas the said writs of summons having been finally disposed of by a dismissal of them, and it is right and proper that the said P. T. Hambleton should be paid his legal fees in serving said writs of summons, therefore—

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Appropriation Maryland, That the Comptroller of the State, be and he hereby is authorized, empowered and directed to draw his warrant upon the Treasurer of the State. for the sum of forty-nine dollars, to be paid out of the oyster fund, to the order of the said P. T. Hambleton, constable as aforesaid, as his legal fees for serving said writs of summons in said cases.

CHAPTER 208.

AN ACT to repeal chapter one hundred and eightynine, of the acts of eighteen hundred and seventytwo, relating to Salisbury Academy, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Convey propertv.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Trustees of Salisbury Academy be, and they are hereby authorized and empowered to convey the property held by them in trust for said Academy, to the School Commissioners of the county of Wicomico, for the purpose and use of a High School for said county, and for no other purpose or use whatsoever.

Applied.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the sum of four hundred dollars, heretofore paid to the School Commissioners for the use of Salisbury Academy, shall be applied to the use and benefit of said High School.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
