The Committee on Chesapeake Bay and its Tributaries was discharged from further consideration of the petition of Joseph M. Simmons and others, asking an amendment of the law of 1872, chapter 54, in reference to "wild fowl."

Mr. Stevens presented the memorial of the officers and managers of the Shelter for colored orphans and friendless colored children, asking an appropriation from the State.

Which was read and referred to the Committee on Finance.

The Senate Joint Resolutions directing the Comptroller to place the credit of certain Insurance Companies amounts therein named,

Was read the second time and ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.
