

person selling any kind of intoxicating drinks, within the above described limits, shall on conviction thereof, be subject to the fines and penalties prescribed by the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, for selling spirituous or fermented liquors without license.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from and after the first day of May, eighteen hundred and seventy-four. In force

CHAPTER 286.

AN ACT authorizing and directing the State Librarian to furnish to the Faculty of Law of the University of Maryland, certain law books from the State Library.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the State Librarian be and he is hereby authorized and directed to cause to be transmitted to the Faculty of Law of the University of Maryland, for the use of the law department of said University, one copy of the Maryland Reports, from volume one to thirty-seven inclusive, Johnson's Maryland Chancery Reports, and Alexander's British Statutes; and a set of the digests of the Maryland Reports by Norris, Brown, and Brune; Merrick, Miller, and Stockett; and Cohen and Lee. Cause to be transmitted

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect after the date of its passage. In force
