CHAPTER 295.

AN ACT to provide for the appointment of counsel to represent the State, in the matter of the arbitration proposed to be had on the boundary line, between Maryland and Virginia, and to appropriate a sum of money to pay the expenses of such arbitration.

To appoint counsel

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor be and he is hereby authorized and requested to appoint one or more counsel to represent the State, in the matter of the arbitration proposed to be had for the settlement of the boundary line between the States of Virginia and Maryland, their compensation and the State's proportion of the compensation of the referees and umpire to be hereafter provided for by law.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the State's propor-State's proportion of the other expenses of said arbitration shall be paid by the State, on a warrant or warrants of the Comptroller on the Treasurer, in favor of such person or persons as the Governor shall, on statements to be furnished by the State's counsel, certify to be entitled to be paid; and the sum of five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated to meet the requirements of this section.

Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
